





Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson is our new Bishop for the Va. Annual Conference of the UMC. Bishop Sue is a Florida native. As a newly ordained bishop, she was appointed to the North Georgia Annual Conference in 2016; she was appointed to our Va. Conference in 2022. She has a very interesting background; she was an attorney in Fl., serving as a federal clerk and then a litigator for a Tampa law firm before answering her call to ministry.

After serving as a pastor in several churches in Florida, she was appointed as a District Superintendent. She guided a diverse area of very large churches and very small churches, urban, suburban, and rural churches; African American, Haitian, Hispanic churches, a Native American ministry, a large camp and retreat center, and a large campus ministry. She was the "missional strategist" for this region, equipping and resourcing churches for ministry and helping them work together to reach their mission fields for Jesus Christ.

The reason I am sharing her history with you is to help all of us fully understand what an outstanding, well rounded, accomplished bishop we have at the helm of our Virginia Annual Conference. We could not have a better person to guide us through this period in our church leading up to the General Conference in April of 2024, to be held in Charlotte NC.

Bishop Sue has made a video that every member of the UMC in Va. needs to watch. I believe our members have been hoping to hear hard facts about where we are right now. If you want straight talk that debunks some of the misinformation out there about our UMC, complete information about where we are right now and where we are going - you really need to watch her video. To see this - google - Advocate Issues vaumc.org – you will see a list of weekly issues – click on February 7, 2023. Scroll down until you see "Skunk on the Table". This is where our communications director invites people to speak about different, hard-to-talk-about issues, to hopefully shed light on solutions based on facts and knowledge. Bishop Sue was asked to address where we are right now on topics including disaffiliation, LGBTQ, Laity & Clergy responsibilities to their churches, and where we will hopefully find ourselves in the future.
