At the 2019 Special Called General Conference of the United Methodist Church, an addendum to the 2016 Book of Discipline was approved and added. One of the new paragraphs was 2553 allowing disaffiliation of a local church over issues related to human sexuality. This choice to disaffiliate from the UMC needs to be made in sufficient time for the process for exiting the denomination to be completed prior to December 31, 2023. Copies of this paragraph are available in the church office.

April 1-30 has been set aside for a time of prayer and discernment to determine the path forward for KUMC congregation concerning the human sexuality issues in our United Methodist Church. On April 30, after our 11 AM Worship Service we will take a straw poll vote to see if a majority of our members want to remain a United Methodist congregation or if they want to proceed with plans to disaffiliate. We ask that you read, study, pray, and learn about the issues before us. Ask God to pour out His Holy Spirit to convict your hearts concerning the way forward for KUMC. The LORD says, "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go. I will guide you with My eye." Psalm 32:8



DISPELLING DARKNESS - On Good Friday, Apr.7, KUMC will be hosting a Tenebrae Worship Service at 7pm. Tenebrae is the Latin word for "darkness" or "shadows". Our Organist/Choir Director Wayne Hare has organized a special choir made up of choir members from our community churches to sing the story of the passion and death of Jesus Christ. Throughout the night the sanctuary gradually grows darker and darker as candles are extinguished. As the service concludes, a single Christ candle stands alone on the altar, reminding worshipers that victory is coming on Easter morning.



Stewardship Event - One of the least discussed and most expensive situations in life is making funeral arrangements! Bryan Wood, Licensed Funeral Director, Advanced Planning Specialist with Currie Funeral gave an informative presentation with helpful suggestions and practical steps for planning our own funeral on March 12. This was a Stewardship Committee special event as we emphasized the gift of peace during March. Eighteen members and guests attended.

Bryan's talk was straightforward and enlightening. He explained there are over 49 decisions that need to be made within the first three days after death. Are you prepared? Bryan said 70% of the time, it is the wife who has the burden of making these decisions.

Currie offers a planning guidebook to help make these decisions ahead of time. They also offer coverage in case a death occurs out of town. Their assistance at time of death is very comprehensive including such things as contacting Social Security, the VA, and helping with obituaries.

Brian stressed how pre planning one's funeral helps to avoid emotional spending upon a loved one's death and can help avoid disagreements in the family.



Period of Discernment: From April 1 thru April 30, KUMC will be in a period of prayerful, intentional discernment as we listen for the Holy Spirit to guide KUMC in our membership's desire to remain an active congregation of the United Methodist Church or pursue a path toward disaffiliation. On Sunday, April 30, immediately following the 11:00 worship service, a straw ballot vote will be taken of members only. No absentee ballots will be permitted. In addition, the sanctuary will be open on Monday, April 17th and Tuesday, April 18 from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. for silent prayer. Further details of this discernment process were mailed and emailed to all members in mid-March. If you did not receive that information, please reach out to the church office.

A Prayer of Discernment:

Father God, we thank you for this day. Father, you are the same today as you were yesterday, and as you will be tomorrow. Since the beginning of mankind, you sought to have a relationship with your creation, to instruct us in the way that we ought to go. Father, today we pray for discernment. We pray that the Holy Spirit that indwells within us will give us a peace beyond understanding to know precisely when something is you, and when something is not.
