Today's Scripture: 1 Verse

Philippians 4:19

And my God will fully satisfy every need of yours according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus.

WHY WE'RE HERE

2 Timothy 3:16-17, All scripture is inspired by God & is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, & for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

CONTEXT

This verse is often misused. Paul is addressing the Philippians, thanking them for their generous support of his ministry. Paul isn't promising that God will make us wealthy or healthy simply by giving financially to the church. This is not promoting a prosperity gospel. This verse does not mean that believers will never experience times of need. It says God's faithful servants will be supplied with what they need to continue to serve.

The Philippians were a poor community, yet out of their poverty, they gave a financial gift to Paul. They did this because they were spiritually invested in the gospel & the ministry Paul was doing in Rome. They gave because they wanted to enable Paul to reach more potential believers. Paul *knew* that everything he truly needed came from God – his strength, endurance & provision of all kinds.

Because of their limited financial resources to meet their own needs, Paul wanted to assure them their efforts were not in vain. God would surely meet their needs according to His riches in Christ Jesus. God promises that as we participate in the ministry of the gospel, we will be blessed. This is a promise for spiritual provision which transcends our circumstances. This is what we will explore.

I pray that God will take care of all your needs with the wonderful blessings that come from Christ Jesus!

Moreover, my God will fill every need of yours according to His glorious wealth, in union with the Messiah Yeshua.

My God will use His glorious riches to give you everything you need. He will do this through Christ Jesus.

GNT

And with all His abundant wealth through Christ Jesus, my God will supply all your needs.

GW

My God will richly fill your every need in a glorious way through Christ Jesus.

And now I have it all - & keep getting more! The gifts you sent with Epaphroditis were more than enough, like a sweet-smelling sacrifice roasting on the altar, filling the air with fragrance, pleasing God to no end. You can be sure that God will take care of everything you need, His generosity exceeding even yours in the glory that pours from Jesus. Our God & Father abounds in glory that just pours out into eternity. Yes.

BREAKING DOWN THE VERSE

And my God will... This is a given. God can be trusted. He withholds no good gift from His children. God will never forsake those who seek Him.

*fully...*Completely – leaving nothing unaddressed.

satisfy...God quenches, satisfies, meets, takes care of & addresses our needs.

every...God leaves nothing out – if we have a desire, wish, want that is not inline with His desire for us, He will bring our heart's desires in line with His desires for us. It is these needs & desires He will provide. His will is always for our good, not against our good. It is through Christ that God's gifts come to us.

*need of yours...*We know the difference between wants & needs, & the difference needs to be remembered as we study this verse. God's perspective of what we need has *eternity* in view. These are the eternal blessings that are ours *in Him*.

according to His riches in glory...It is true riches that should guide & hold sway over us. Glorious riches in Christ Jesus are what come into our lives when we allow Him to be the controlling center of our lives. God possesses riches of glory. His glory is rich! True riches are the things money can't buy.

*in Christ Jesus...*It is because of Jesus, through Jesus, that God has willingly become our "supplier." Through Jesus, all things were made, & He is our provider.

- 2 Corinthians 4:17, For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure.
- 2 Corinthians 5:21, For our sake He made Him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.
- 2 Corinthians 9:8, And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work.

1 Timothy 6:17, As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

James 1:17, Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change.

2 Peter 1:10-11, Therefore, brothers & sisters, be all the more eager to confirm your call & election, for if you do this, you will never stumble. For in this way, entry into the eternal kingdom of our Lord & Savior Jesus Christ will be richly provided for you.

SUMMARY

In what circumstances is this verse reassuring or comforting? What are other examples of the glorious riches in Christ Jesus we experience now or can anticipate enjoying in eternity?

Think of the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23): love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness & self-control. Add to these hope, strength, perseverance, endurance, character & more. Are these true riches? Can we purchase them? From where do they come? These are

examples of our needs to survive, thrive, please God & have the abundant life Jesus died to give us.

CONCLUSION

With Jesus as our provider, we will never lack. God, His Father & ours, is infinitely wealthy ("We are children of God, & if children, then heirs, heirs of God & joint heirs with Christ," Romans 8:16a-17a). He will never run out of resources. His supply of all things is endless, & He knows what we need!

Our concept of "need' must be determined according to *God's will & His interpretation* of what our needs truly are. He knows we need whatever allows us to have access to Him. This includes the abundant life Jesus died for us to have, a life of super-abundance, not lack. God wants our lives to abound in fullness, & He blesses those who use the resources they've been given according to *His* purposes & desires.

God wants us to recognize our need for Him, to be filled with Him & His Spirit. He wants our lives to abound in joy ("The joy of the Lord is my strength," Nehemiah 8:10). He knows we need strength of spirit, soul & body, things that can *only* be found in Him. He knows we need to appreciate & give thanks for the fullness in our lives & the abundance we too often look past.

God knew that in order for *us* to have the perfect relationship with *Him*, we couldn't be in a position to be "condemned." He needed us to be holy enough to approach Him as our Father. The Trinity made this possible through the life, death & resurrection of His own Son. ("There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus," Romans 8:1.)

All these needs & more are met in our Savior, the Messiah, the Christ. God loves us so much that He promised full satisfaction of *all* our needs *according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus*!

Why?

Because He is Love;

Because He loves us;

Because He gave His Son for us;

Because He can;

Because He thinks we're worth it –
Because we are the righteousness of God, *in Christ*!
